Assault

All four of the reported assaults occurred at a local residential establishment.

Burglaries

Once again, we have had a month free of burglaries. This is great news but please remain vigilant and continue to report any suspicious behaviour you witness to police immediately. With the finer weather we're experiencing, please ensure you have remembered to close and lock all windows and doors before leaving the house and if you are out enjoying the weather in the back garden, please ensure the front of your house is left secure.

Non dwelling burglaries

A fork lift truck and other items were stolen from a garden centre at Ower. A bike was stolen from a property in Minstead and a safe and items of clothing were stolen from a garden centre at Cadnam.

Criminal damage

There were two attacks on sheep by dogs. One was at Penn Common and the other at Minstead. Both resulted in the livestock being killed. There was also damage caused to a vehicle which was causing an obstruction. An individual has been dealt with in connection with this incident. Wires on the outside of a storage unit building were cut by persons unknown.

Theft

Four mobile phones and one camera were stolen from individuals at a local amusement park. Seven chickens were stolen from Bartley and a gold chain was stolen from the field at Calmore Cricket Club.

Our current Safer Neighbourhoods team priorities are:

1. Working with partner agencies to ensure that issues affecting the quality of life in residential areas are dealt with promptly and effectively.
2. Patrolling New Forest car parks to help reduce vehicle crime.

Thefts from motor vehicles

Several lorries have had diesel stolen from their tanks while they've been parked up and unattended. There have been two thefts from vehicles parked at a pub in Cadnam, two from vehicles parked at Busketts Lawn car park and one at Pipers Wait car park.

Road traffic incidents (RTIs)

There were four 'damage only' incidents at Minstead, Ower, the M27 and the A337. There was one RTI involving a deer on the Ringwood Road. There were five incidents on the A36, A31 and A337 in which individuals were injured and sadly there was also a fatal road traffic incident at Fritham.
