### Anti-social behaviour

We received four noise complaints, three reports of neighbour disputes, as well as reports of rowdy youths, nuisance telephone calls and car park nuisance. Please continue to report all incidents to police by calling **101**.

### Assaults

One report this month, where a man was arrested after an incident at a caravan park.

### Burglary (other than a dwelling)

A garage was broken into at a premises in Ower, and a dumper-truck and plant equipment to the value of around £19,000 was stolen from a barn in Minstead.

### Criminal damage

Only one report this month, where a car window was smashed at a property in Thatchbury.

### Making off without payment

There have been six reports of vehicles filling up with fuel and then driving away without paying. We have arrested and dealt with a man in relation to this offence.

Our team priorities are set by our communities – we target the issues that you tell us are of concern in the areas you live in, and we work with colleagues and partner agencies to tackle local problems:

1. Working with partner agencies to ensure that issues affecting the quality of life in residential areas are dealt with promptly and effectively.
2. Patrolling New Forest car parks to help reduce vehicle crime.

### Theft from a vehicle

Three of the reported thefts from vehicles this month have been in forest car parks, where windows were smashed and handbags were stolen. These incidents can be avoided! Please remember never to leave any valuables in your car – if you want to keep it, take it with you.

### Theft

We have had 14 thefts reported, and two took place at a local theme park – this is much lower than last month which is positive, but please remember to keep all your valuables safe when out and about. Ensure any bags are securely fastened and do not leave them unattended.

There has been a shoplifting offence from a shop, batteries stolen from a field in Bramshaw, and a signboard was taken from outside of a pub in Bartley.

An electric fence box was stolen from a field in Copythorne and copper wire was stolen in Bramshaw. We also had a report of lead being taken from a local school, and when the same thing happened the following night, a member of the local Neighbourhood Watch group saw the offence and reported it to police. We have made arrests and dealt with two men.

A wallet was taken after being accidentally left on top of a wooden post, a handbag was taken from inside a tent whilst the owners were out for a walk at the Ocknell campsite, and two statues were stolen from outside a property in Ower.

We've had a report of diesel being taken from a vehicle tank while at a local golf club, and in a separate incident, a set of golf clubs stolen from someone's driveway. One man was arrested for this offence.

## COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

Speeding is one of the factors that most affects the roads of the New Forest, so a Community Speedwatch programme is being introduced. This is managed by police but carried out by volunteers, who receive the equipment and training to monitor and record traffic speed in identified problem areas, so that the registered owners of offending vehicles can be contacted and warned. This is a non-confrontational approach to speed education which can make a real difference in our local villages using volunteers from the community.
