Assault

One of the two reported assaults was domestic related and the other involved an assault on a police officer during an arrest.

Criminal damage

Fencing was cut in Cadnam and fencing and padlocks were damaged in Minstead and Ower. Damage was caused to a brand new hire car in Bramshaw and two youths have been arrested in connection with this. In a separate incident, damage was caused to the boot of a car in Minstead.

Burglary

We are pleased to report that there have been no dwelling or non-dwelling burglaries reported this month. This is good news but we would advise residents not to become complacent and to remain vigilant at all times. Please ensure doors and windows are closed and locked before you go out and before you go to bed and report any suspicious activity you witness to police immediately.

We are also pleased to report that officers have made some arrests in connection with burglaries that occurred in our area during January.

Theft

Lead was stolen from Bartley School and some scrap was stolen from a skip at Copythorne. Six hanging baskets were stolen from the Empress of Blandings and the top of a staddle stone was stolen from Newbridge. Shoplifting occurred at the Ower Services and several padlocks were stolen from gates on land at Ower.

Thefts from motor vehicles

There have been four thefts from vehicles parked in Forest car parks in the Bramshaw area this month. There have also been two thefts from vehicles parked at private addresses in the Bramshaw and Cadnam areas. Please do not leave valuables inside your unattended vehicles, even if they are parked on your own property. Also, always double check you have locked your vehicles and closed all windows.

Road traffic incidents (RTIs)

Police have attended and dealt with eight road traffic incidents this month. Fortunately, none of these involved serious injuries. There were two 'damage only' incidents on the A31, one on the B3079 and one on the M27. There was one 'animal injury' incident on the B3079, involving a pony. There were two minor injury RTIs on the A31 and one on the A36.
