There were 95 reported incidents in January.

There has been a slight increase in crime this month, especially in the Winsor and Copythorne areas. However, there has also been an increase in the number of people arrested in connection with these offences. Individuals have been arrested in connection with the cable theft from a local amusement park, which was mentioned in the December report. One of the burglary arrests was as a direct result of a Neighbourhood Watch member recording a suspicious vehicle number and reporting it to us at the time - so please take notice of anything suspicious or unusual and report to us straight away.

Assault

Three of the reported assaults occurred at a local residential establishment. One involved a man in Winsor being hit by what he believed was a ball bearing and the fifth occurred in Furzley Road.

Burglary

Several properties in the Winsor and Copythorne area have been targeted over the last month. One address was attacked twice and laptops, a TV and a watch were stolen. A man has been arrested in connection with this and enquiries are ongoing.

The dwelling quarters of a local pub were burgled and jewellery was stolen. Two men have been arrested in connection with this and are helping police with their enquiries.

Burglary - non dwelling

A chainsaw was stolen from an outbuilding at a property in Ower.

Criminal damage

Four vehicles parked in Bartley had their wing mirrors damaged.

Thefts from motor vehicles

Four thefts from vehicles occurred in Forest car parks in the Brook and Fritham areas, with windows being smashed and handbags stolen. Three vehicles parked in the car park of an Ower pub were also targeted and property stolen. A man has been arrested in connection with this.

Theft

A local garden centre has had two thefts, with fish tank pumps being stolen on the first occasion and a valuable Koi Carp on the second. An address at Stoney Cross had garden machinery stolen and a JCB excavator was stolen from the former Riverside Garden Centre at Ower. Two large green winged macaws were stolen from Paultons Park in January. We are pleased to report that the birds were recovered by police a couple of days later and returned to the park. Two people have been arrested in connection with the theft.

Road traffic incidents (RTIs)

There were two RTIs involving animals and two minor injury RTIs on the B3079. There were five damage only RTIs, with two on the A31, two at Ower and one at Copythorne.
