There were 73 incidents reported to police in June 2011.

Anti-social behaviour

Police attended a local sports club, near to Netley Marsh, after reports that a fight was taking place.

A group of youths were spoken to and asked to leave a local campsite due to reports of rowdy behaviour.

Police attended a local electricity site to help security staff deal with a report of trespassing.

There were also a number of disputes between neighbours reported to police.

Burglaries

There were no dwelling burglaries reported during June, which is very good news for the neighbourhood. However, we would urge residents to remain vigilant over the summer months and to ensure all windows and doors are closed and locked before they go out or go to bed.

There were three non-dwelling burglaries reported. These included a buffer, worth £1000, being stolen from a school in Bartley and a horse carriage, worth £2,500, being stolen from a farm in the Minstead area. A chainsaw, strimmer and other items were also stolen from a local barn.

Our current Safer Neighbourhoods team priorities are:

1. Working with partner agencies to ensure that issues affecting the quality of life in residential areas are dealt with promptly and effectively.
2. Patrolling New Forest car parks to help reduce vehicle crime.

Theft

Heavy duty batteries were removed from a small holding at Cadnam Green but were discovered nearby. Two men in a white van were seen in the locality around the time of this incident. Anyone who witnessed anything suspicious or who has any information which could help police with their enquiries is asked to contact us on **101**.

A purse and mobile phone were stolen from a woman's bag in Fritham.

A wallet was stolen at a local petrol station. Enquiries are ongoing.

Theft from vehicle

Three of the thefts from motor vehicles reported occurred in Forest car parks. Windows were smashed and handbags and mobile phones were taken from the vehicles. Please ensure you **remove all valuables from your vehicle** before leaving them unattended in local beauty spot car parks. If you notice any suspicious behaviour around vehicles then please report this to police immediately.
