There were 71 reported incidents in March.

### Assault

Two of the reported assaults occurred at a local residential establishment. A man was assaulted in Ower and another man has been arrested in connection with this. There was also one assault of a domestic nature reported.

### Criminal damage

A vehicle travelling westbound on the A31 had its windscreen damaged by a stone. A vehicle that had been causing an obstruction in Minstead was being moved and damaged another vehicle that was parked close by.

### Burglaries

There was one dwelling burglary reported in March. A property was broken into and jewellery was stolen.

Please remain vigilant, take extra care in securing your homes and report any suspicious behaviour you witness to police immediately.

### Non dwelling burglaries

A pitchfork was stolen from an outbuilding on a farm in Cadnam. A garage at Bartley was broken into and tools and a petrol lawnmower were removed.

### Theft

A business at Cadnam had wire fencing cut and alloy wheels were stolen.

A 'Freeview' box was taken from a local residential establishment.

### Our current Safer Neighbourhoods team priorities are:

1. Working with partner agencies to ensure that issues affecting the quality of life in residential areas are dealt with promptly and effectively.
2. Patrolling New Forest car parks to help reduce vehicle crime.

### Reporting suspicious activity

Your reports and information are valuable to us and can help us to target our patrols effectively.
