Assault

14 occurred at local residential establishments. One was a domestic incident.

Burglaries

A property was entered while the occupants were in the grounds and a wallet was stolen.

Anti-social behaviour

Reports of a vehicle parked on a public highway with no tax.

A man was seen throwing litter from a vehicle.

Non dwelling burglaries

An attempt was made to break into a garden centre at Ower.

Two mini motos were stolen from an outbuilding in the Barrowhill Road area.

Criminal damage

A window of a car parked in Bramshaw was smashed, nothing was taken.

A lock was cut on the gate to a plantation this has occurred on several occasions.

Eggs were thrown at a house and a car wing mirror smashed at a house at Cadnam. This is an ongoing investigation.

A golf centre had damage caused to phone lines.

Our current Safer Neighbourhoods team priorities are:

1. Working with partner agencies to ensure that issues affecting the quality of life in residential areas are dealt with promptly and effectively.
2. Patrolling New Forest car parks to help reduce vehicle crime.

Theft

A mobile phone was stolen from a café in a local theme park.

A garden statue was stolen from a front garden at Loperwood.

A group of men were arrested after an attempt was made to steal a golf buggy at a local golf club.

Four reports of making off without payment at Ower petrol station.

Theft from vehicle

There were three thefts from vehicles in forest car parks in Pipers Wait, Bramshaw and Fritham areas where handbags had been stolen by smashing windows of vehicles. One of which was a convertible that had the roof slashed in order to get the property from the vehicle. A catalytic converter was removed from a van parked in a layby at Bartley and 150 litres of diesel was taken from a vehicle at Ower.

Public order

One incident at secure accommodation in Bartley

A fixed penalty noticed was issued to a male who had thrown eggs through a drive through window at Ower.
