Incidents of note:

Assault

Three men were arrested for assault following domestic arguments and a woman was arrested following two assaults at a residential establishment.

Dwelling Burglary

We are pleased to report that there have once again been no dwelling burglaries. However, there have been reports in neighbouring areas so please don't be tempted to leave your home without checking that you have closed and locked all your doors and windows.

Burglary – non dwelling

Entry was gained to an outside store of Paulton's Cricket Club but nothing was stolen. A large quantity of cigarettes were stolen during a burglary at a store in Bartley. There was also an attempted burglary at a public house but no entry was gained.

Criminal Damage

A woman was arrested and charged with criminal damage following an incident at a local establishment. In separate incidents damage was caused to a car in Whitemoor Lane and to some fencing in Canterton Lane, Bramshaw.

Thefts from motor vehicles

There have been six thefts from vehicles in car parks in the Bramshaw and Fritham areas. Please remove all your valuables from your car when leaving it unattended. **If it's not left in the car, it can't be stolen.** A lorry parked in a layby on the A31 had 600 litres of diesel stolen overnight.

Theft

A man has been arrested and charged following the theft of a bicycle at Cadnam. There have been two thefts of handbags at a local theme park while the owners were on rides. Tack was stolen from a horse trailer in Winsor, a cool box was stolen overnight from outside a caravan at Ocknell campsite and finally a Biffa bin was stolen from outside a public house. It was later tracked and recovered by a police dog.

Road Traffic Incidents (RTIs)

There were three road traffic collisions on the B3079, one of which was damage only and the other two resulted in the death of two foals. Another pony was killed at Nomansland.

PC Dee Faulkner and PC Andy White joined the Roads Policing Unit to conduct an education and enforcement day. Motorists were stopped if committing driving offences in and around Lyndhurst.

Motorists were given the opportunity to attend an education session rather than receive a fixed penalty ticket. Further operations will be conducted in the future.
