Some cut logs were stolen from Brook and a local amusement park had reels of armoured electrical cable stolen during the afternoon of November 23. Anyone with any information about this incident is urged to contact police.

### Road Traffic Incidents (RTIs)

There were two RTIs on the B3078 in Cadnam which resulted in animal injuries.

There were five 'damage only' RTIs on the M27, the A326, the A336, the A36 and Winsor Road.

One RTI at Cadnam resulted in one individual suffering minor injuries.

### Thefts from motor vehicles

Vehicles parked at Busketts Lawn, Canada Common and Fritham and at three pubs were broken into this month. In all incidents thieves either smashed windows or forced boots to steal handbags or other valuable items. **Please don't leave valuables in your cars. Thieves will often wait and watch you leave your vehicle so don't be tempted to hide valuables under the seat or in the boot.**

### Incidents of note:

#### Assault

A nine-year-old boy was bitten by a dog in Bartley and suffered facial injuries. A local woman is helping police with their enquiries. Two incidents occurred at a local residential establishment.

#### Criminal damage

A vehicle parked in Bartley had three tyres punctured and a vehicle parked in Cadnam was damaged. Five small window panes were damaged at a pub in Bartley.

#### Burglary

Unfortunately, we have seen an increase in the number of burglaries this month, with a total of four. Most of these incidents occurred during the day while the occupants were not at home. Please review your household

security and ensure all doors and windows are kept locked and that no Christmas presents are left out on display. In two of these incidents nothing was stolen but in the other two burglaries items taken by the thieves included jewellery, cameras, laptops and furniture.

#### Burglary - non dwelling

Two local stores were targeted by thieves and cigarettes and tobacco were stolen. Elsewhere a quad bike was stolen from a garage in Winsor and cash was stolen from a garage in Bramshaw.

#### Thefts

A trailer was stolen from an address in Winsor.

An ex-employee stole items from an employer prior to leaving.
