Thefts from motor vehicles

There have been four thefts from vehicles parked in forest car parks in the Bramshaw and Fritham areas. The car windows were smashed and handbags were stolen.

Please remove all valuables from your vehicle when leaving it unattended. If it's not left in the car it can't be stolen. Don't give opportunist thieves an opportunity!

Theft

Two people had their mobile phones stolen from their bags while at a local theme park. A lady left her handbag in a taxi and it was subsequently stolen. A man had his wallet stolen from his jacket while at a hotel and a purse was stolen from a member of staff at a local nursing home.

Road Traffic Incidents (RTIs)

There was one fatal accident on Ringwood Road at Fritham and an accident in which someone was injured near the Bramble Hill Hotel. There were three RTIs on the B3079 which all involved animals and three damage only accidents on the A36, A337 and A31.

There were 60 reported incidents in September, which is a good reduction from the number reported in August. However, non-dwelling burglaries and thefts appear to have slightly increased again. We have been passing out lots of crime prevention advice to the local community and the team are also doing extra night time patrols to try and combat this.

Incidents of note:

Assault

A man was assaulted following an argument at work between two work colleagues. Another assault occurred at a local residential establishment.

Dwelling Burglary

We are pleased to report that there have once again been no dwelling burglaries but please remain vigilant and don't be tempted to leave your home without checking that you have closed and locked all your doors and windows.

Burglary – non dwelling

700 litres of diesel were stolen from a tank at premises in Ower overnight on September 13. Two properties nearby to each other had sheds/garages broken into overnight on September 20 and tools were stolen. Another shed was broken into on September 28 at Ower during the afternoon and a lawn mower was stolen. Also on September 28, a local pub was broken into during the afternoon and cash and alcohol were stolen.

Criminal Damage

A caravan window was smashed at a campsite in Whitemoor Lane. One man was arrested in connection with this incident and is being dealt with by police.
