42. PLANNING MATTERS

(a) Current applications: Members agreed to comment as follows on current planning applications:

07/91698 St Julia, Winsor Road, Winsor (House; access alterations; demolition of existing dwelling). Object (4)

07/91673 Field onto Shepherds Road, Bartley (Form new field access). Object (4)

07/91725 13 Pundle Green, Bartley (Side and rear single-storey extensions). Support (3)

(b) Decisions, etc: A paper tabled at the meeting contained details of recent planning decisions, together with appeal and enforcement matters (appendix 1 in the minute book).

43. PLANNING TRAINING FOR TOWN AND PARISH COUNCILLORS

NFDC had planned three planning training sessions at different venues during July, but had now postponed the Totton session on 17 July. Noted, Councillor Moriarty to attend the Ringwood session (13 July) and Councillor Stenson to advise availability for the Lymington session (19 July). (Note: All sessions subsequently postponed through lack of response)

44. PARISH WEBSITE

Councillor Good had offered to manage the Parish website on the Council's behalf. The aim would be to introduce new and interesting material and update the site on a regular basis. Councillor Good would prepare draft proposals for future content so that any constraints on volume/type of material could be checked with the site host, NFDC. All material would need to be submitted to Cllr Good in electronic form. It was agreed to form a sub group (comprising Cllrs Good, Moriarty, Samways and Stenson) to discuss initial proposals/material and make recommendations to the Council.

45. PROPOSED AIRSPACE CHANGES IN THE NEW FOREST

Members received details of a proposal by National Air Traffic Services to change the airspace structure affecting parts of south Hampshire, including areas of the New Forest. The proposal involved creation of a new airspace, some five nautical miles west of the existing, to systemise north/south traffic flows to and from Bournemouth and Southampton airports. The new airspace would be available for use before 0930 and after 1730 daily and would affect parts of the New Forest National Park.

The National Park Authority was formulating a response which would highlight the detrimental impact on the special qualities of the New Forest, in particular its relative tranquility. Members agreed to support the NPA response.

46. OTHER MATTERS

- (b) *Foxbury Plantation:* The Chairman suggested a presentation by the National Trust on this topic
- (c) *Police Community Support Officer:* Cllr Good referred to his recent contact with the PCSO for this area . Agreed, invite to future Council meeting.

During the public participation session, residents of Winsor Road expressed concern about disturbance from horses being grazed on land to the rear of their property. The site was formerly used by Cadnam FC and was leased out by Hampshire County Council. The horses caused noise and attracted flies and were visited several times a day by their owners. There were also traffic dangers from horse boxes being left on the road.
