67. DECLARATION OF INTERESTS

Councillor Riddoch declared a non-pecuniary interest in planning application 12/97653 (Land at Brockishill Road, Bartley).

68. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Joy Vallis referred to the need for enforcement of the 30 mph speed limit in Southampton Road. The speed sign near the Haywain junction was also obscured by tree foliage.

The Chairman stated that the Council had requested an extension of the 30 mph limit beyond Bourne Road to encourage slower speeds towards the Haywain from the east. PC Dee Faulkner was also attending the next Council meeting to give an update on Speedwatch and the matter of traffic speeds could be raised then. The Council would also ask the highway authority to clear the obstruction from the speed sign.

69. PLANNING MATTERS

New applications: Members agreed the following responses to current applications:

- 12/97703 Elvin, White Hart Lane, Cadnam (Single storey rear extension; front porch; alterations to fenestration (Amended plans). Support (3)
- 12/97741 Heathlands Farm, Old Salisbury Road, Ower (Agricultural workers dwelling). Support (3)

Enforcement: The Clerk referred to possible planning breaches at Cosy Cottage, Southampton Road, Cadnam. Enforcement were investigating.

70. TRAFFIC ISSUES, OLD SALISBURY ROAD

Since the last meeting, members had met residents on site at Old Salisbury Road to discuss the reported highway issues, principally the dangers of speeding traffic entering and leaving the Paultons Golf Centre. It was agreed to make an approach to the highway authority to find possible solutions. A request would also be made for a 30 mph speed limit in Old Salisbury Road.

71. COPYTHORNE FOOTPATHS

Members noted completed footpath inspection reports, as circulated with the agenda. It was agreed to consider any necessary representations to Rights of Way once the outstanding reports were received.

In the meantime, the following matters would be pursued:

- motorcyclists using footpaths 14, 15 and 16 – raise with landowner initially
- enclosure of land on footpath 2 into domestic curtilage – report to Enforcement

72. HIGHWAY SIGNAGE IN 30 MPH LIMITS

Further to minute 62, Councillor Heron had agreed in principle to allocate £250 from his devolved budget for traffic speed posters in the new speed limit areas. It was hoped that a similar contribution would be made by Councillor Mans.
