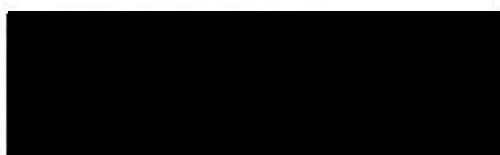

## **Victim Support supporting information**

### **3. Description of project and the needs it will serve:**

Victim Support offers free and confidential help to victims of crime, witnesses, their family and friends. We strive to deliver a local approach to our service – residents of Copythorne are supported by locally trained staff and volunteers ensuring a professional service with a local knowledge. Our trained volunteers offer someone to talk to in confidence, information on police and court procedures, practical items such as personal alarms and small security items for the home (dummy CCTV, window or door alarms to make people feel safer in their homes) and help in dealing with other organisations.

To purchase security items that we provide free of charge to victims and their families such as personal alarms and small security items for the home -dummy CCTV, window or door alarms to make people feel safer in their homes. These used to be funded via the Prisoner's Earnings Act however that funding has now ceased and as this truly beneficial resource has such a positive impact on victim's recovery we are seeking funding to continue this provision.

Victim Support (VS) is an independent charity dedicated to supporting victims of crime and traumatic incidents in England and Wales. Our purpose is to provide specialist help to support people to cope and recover to the point where they feel they are back on track with their lives.

Last year nationally we were in contact with over 1,035,032 victims of crime last year offering information, advice and support. 704,219 people visited our website and our dedicated local teams provided specialist emotional and practical support to 133,965 victims.

We are independent of the government, the police, local authorities and criminal justice system, but work closely with them and others to achieve our vision – a world where victims and witnesses are given the support they need and the respect they deserve.

Victim Support works with victims of crime and we put them at the heart of our organisation and the way we run our services. Our work, our support and our voice is informed and shaped by them.

As an organisation, victims are our only focus, and over the years we have developed unrivalled expertise in their needs, aspirations and their journey through the criminal justice system.

We are a national organisation but we are deeply rooted in the local communities in which we work.

£50 could purchase 10 fake CCTV cameras, 31 window alarms, 21 door handle alarms or 27 segment timers that can help to make people feel safer in their homes. It could also purchase 31 personal alarms to aid victim's confidence to feel safer and find the strength to move forward after crime. This demonstrates what could be purchased but the final combination of items would be chosen to best reflect the needs of the victims we work with.

## **6. Membership details:**

Due to GDPR regulations we are unable to provide exact statistical information for your parish, however in previous years we have supported an average of 23 Copythorne residents and we would not expect this number to differ year on year. Any victim or witness can access our services. Between 01/04/17-31/03/18 we supported 3,302 Hampshire and IOW residents via our community based service
