Burglaries: One home, in Exbury, has been burgled this month and two arrests have already been made so there isn't much more that we can tell you at this stage. 10 outbuildings in Cadnam, Exbury, Emery Down, Hill Street, Bucklers Hard, Bartley, Ower and Winsor have been broken into and fishing gear, a leaf blower and some lead stolen. A quad bike has also been taken from a garage in Ashurst, and thieves broke into a kiosk at Paultons Park overnight but nothing was taken.

Theft From Motor Vehicle: This month 10 vehicles have been broken into the New Forest Heart area. Whitefield Moor, Shepherds Gutter and the Rufus Stone are the Forest car parks targeted and vehicles parked on the roadside in Lyndhurst and Ashurst and at the Rhinefield Hotel have also had items stolen from them.

The Police and Crime Commissioners for Hampshire has published an excellent guide to Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB), which is consistently named as the main concern of residents throughout the County. ASB covers a broad spectrum of issues and sometimes it can be difficult to know who to report certain issues to.

In other incidents a man has been arrested for one theft at the Beaulieu Auto Jumble and we are still looking to identify a group of men who it is believed stole approximately £2000 from another stand at the event. £400 was stolen when thieves cut the pockets of a man's shorts while he was wearing them at the Netley Marsh Autojumble on the same weekend.

A digger was driven away from a building site in Brockenhurst, tools have been taken from a trailer at Emery Down and taps and some scrap metal were stolen from a garden in Cadnam. I'm delighted to say that two ladies living in Lyndhurst have reported to us that they have been the victims of an attempted phone scam this month. I'm delighted because on both occasions the ladies had been to one of my Scam Busting talks and they knew that they were being conned and hung up. The caller was trying to convince them that they were from the Metropolitan police and that their bank cards were being used in London and that they needed to transfer all of their money into a safe account that only the Police had access to. Both ladies saw through these lies and hung up.

The weather this month has meant that many of our Speed Watch sessions have been cancelled. But the Ashurst team went out onto the Woodlands Road on one occasion and the New Forest Roads Campaign team was out 3 times on Roger Penny Way and on the Brockenhurst Road at Hatchet Pond. The Copythorne team went out 3 times in September, monitoring over 1,000 vehicles on roads where the limit is 30 mph. Almost three quarters of those vehicles were breaking the speed limit and a total of 138 warning letters have been sent out by the Police. 4 drivers were surveyed doing over 50 mph.
