1. Welcome/apologies for absence – All four Advisory Committee members present, along with David Rigby (Parish Clerk) as observer and note taker. Apologies received from Jemima Phipps & Simon Cramp of HCC Flood & Water Management Team on morning of meeting. The Chairman explained that the meeting would, even though the HCC representatives were not present, still follow the slide sequence originally planned.
